Kenosha Pass

To his great satisfaction, Walt Whitman was once detained for an hour at Kenosha Summit. From this lofty vantage point on the D,SP&P Railway he penned the following: *At this immense height the South Park stretches fifty miles before me. Mountainous chains and peaks in every variety of perspective, every hue of vista, fringe the view. . . for a hundred miles or so.*

These sentiments are echoed by many contemporary artists.

Cline Ranch

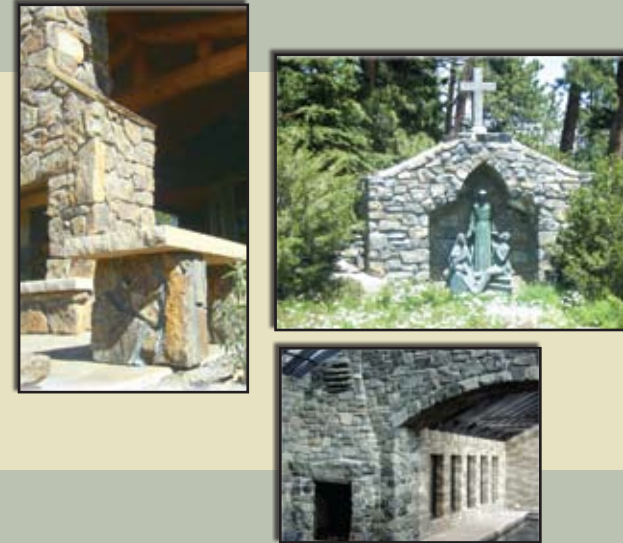

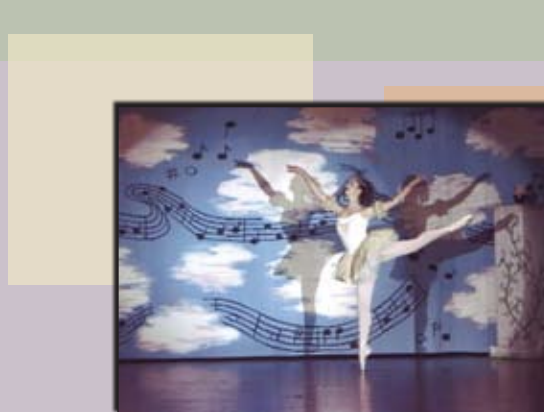
